Eames Avenue	North Haven. Named after Alfred Eames an early resident
East Comboyne Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A rural locality about 2km SE of the Town of Comboyne, and 2km E of Mount Bulli.
Easy Creek Gazetted: 22 Nov 1968	A non-perennial stream rising about 3.2km NW of Camerons Bluff trig. station. It flows generally SE for about 2.4km into Cockerawombeeba Creek.
Edens	New home of H.D. McKinnon and his wife (E.H. Hollis) at Upper Hastings. 3 May 1905.
Edinburgh House	Mentioned in PMN, 9 May 1931, p.5. See Edinburgh House.
Edinburgh House	Two storied house in Clarence Street Port Macquarie. Occupied by Rev. Robert Davidson when he first came to town. Mrs Tizzie Wilson there 5 Nov 1896.
Edwards Corner	In Port Macquarie The SW corner of Horton and Gordon St. Originally owned by the Dick family (tanner) - bought by Eccott Edwards.
Edwards Street	Port Macquarie. Possibly named after the Edwards family. George Edwards was Town Clerk for 41 years from 1887.
Eilenborough	See Ellenborough (see PMN, 3 Oct 1894, p.6).
Eland	Farm on Hannah's Road Bulga State Forest south of Ellenborough River.
Elands	Small village about 26km SW of Comboyne – possibly a link with the Boer War veterans from around that area who served in South Africa.
Elbee Glen	C.L.U. Bosanquet's farm at Birdwood.
Elby Glen	Farm on Forbes River 12km NW of Beechwood.
Electric Light Falls Gazetted: 14 Feb 1969	A waterfall on the Thone River about 2km ENE of the town of Comboyne and about 5.5km SE of Innes trig. station.
Elfords Road	Runs to The Hatch.

Elizabeth Street	Port Macquarie. One of the streets in the early settlement that was lost when the town was re-aligned and renamed in 1831. Ran parallel to present day Clarence Street.
Ellenborough Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A parish (lands administrative division).
Ellenborough Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A village locality situated on the Ellenborough River about 1km S of its confluence with the Hastings River. It is about 26km W of Wauchope. Named by John Oxley after Edward Law, 1st Baron Ellenborough the then Chief Justice of England.
Ellenborough Falls	Falls on Ellenborough River near Elands.
Ellenborough River Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A mostly perennial stream being a southern tributary of the Hastings River, and rising about 6.4km SSW of Blue Knob. It flows generally NE for about 45km into the Hastings River at Ellenborough.
Ellengoing	Hastings River - Cdr Thomas Caswell RN died there 4 Jul 1872. Property of Thomas Caswell son of Thos. Caswell RN - his children were born there 1864 -70. Possibly 700 acres at Redbank.
Ellengrove	Property 6km SE of Pappinbarra on the south side of the Pappinbarra Road.
Ellerslie Cottage	Home of the Trotter family Huntingdon.
Elsinore	House built for John Hibbard (Snr) by John Condon about 1911 at the corner of Gordon St. and Hastings River Drive. School Inspector Nolan lived there 1885 - Dr N. McLaren lived there - known as Linden Travellers Hostel 1990-1991. Currently Backpacker's hostel.
Elston	Farm on Kendall-Lorne road 3km E of Lorne.
Eltham	Property of Edward Reid (see PMN, 5 Jun 1934).
Emoh	Residence of George John Wilson, Owen St. Port Macquarie (see PMN, 6 Dec 1919).
Endeavour Place	Port Macquarie. Named after Captain Cook's vessel HMB Endeavour.
Enfield State Forest	Yarrowitch area just north of Oxley Highway near Mt. Seaview turnoff.
Engowie	Property of Thomas Alison Scott, pioneer of the sugar industry. (No further details).

Ennis	Name given to that district east of Wauchope where the early settlement occurred. Named by the McDonough family after a location in Ireland near where they lived. Ennis meaning “a finger of land.”
Ennis Methodist Church	Was erected by Josiah Secombe, Athur Turnball and Jack Bain. (see People and Places, Vol.3, p.18).
Eucha Buneeben	Home of Isabella Graham (nee McGregor) Koree Island area.
Eugowra	Station 3km north of Rollands Plains east of Rollands Plains Road Property of T. D. Wilson 10 May 1902 – for lease for 3-5 years. Property of Rudder at Rollands Plains (see PMN, 23 Apr 1921). Dairy farm of Herbert John Wilson 1906-1911. They went to Maryborough Queensland G.J. Wilson 1881- to let 40 acres 9 Jul 1904. M.G. Rudder there Rollands Plains 2 Sep 1911.
Euka Buneeben	Property at Koree Island belonging to John and Isabella Graham.
Euroka Creek	Tributary of the Macleay River SW of Kempsey joins just west of Kempsey.
Everard Street	Maybe after John Everard a politician. Everard Street went from Granite Street to Pacific Drive but it was broken by swamps and creeks. It now only goes from Pacific Drive to Owen Street.
Evergreen	Station on Cowal Creek Road on Morton’s Creek 6km W of Bellangry.
Everinghams Crossing Gazetted: 5 Mar 2004	A ford over Batar Creek on Cedar Loggers Lane in the locality of Batar Creek. Origin: Named after a pioneer farmer of the Batar Creek locality, Henry Everingham.
Evermore	Station E of Pacific Highway W of Lake Innes 2km N of Ryan's Road.
Evingstones Swamp (possibly Levingstone)	An early name for the 166 acres of land now taken up by the Port Macquarie Racecourse. (see NSW Legislative Council Journal 12 1865).
