Hayward House

This was believed to have been built for Charles Hayward a convict who arrived in Australia in March 1826. It was the birth home of Frederick Hayward who was Port Macquarie's second mayor.

It is believed that the building was originally a single storey and built in about 1840. It is thought the second storey was added in about 1850. A special feature of this building is its internal wooden staircase. It was built by William Anderson and is still used today.

Situated in the centre of the present shopping area, it is privately leased for retail or commercial purposes.

The building is classified by the National Trust of Australia (NSW).

Located in Horton Street Port Macquarie.
