



Idant Street	Camden Haven. Street named after the timber boat "Idant". Built in 1918 it ran into the north break wall at Camden Head and sank in 1940.
Idlewide	Farm on Hannah's Road, Bulga State Forest - Ellenborough River.
Ifield	Station on the Pacific Highway between the Oxley Highway and Wauchope about 14km from the turn off at the junction of Pacific Highway and Oxley Highway.
Illawong	Farm on the Bellangry Road 6km south of Bellangry.
Indiamba	Farm south side of the Hastings River 3km west of Dennis Bridge. Adjoins "Glenewan".
Indian Head	Small headland at Diamond Head south of Camden Haven.
Ingleside	Comboyne. Property of J.M. Warwick (see PMN, 14 Jan 1922).
Inlet Creek Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A partly perennial stream rising about 400m SW of Forbes Trig Station. It flows generally SW for about 11.2 km into the Forbes River about 1.6 km N of Birdwood.
Inlet Reserve Gazetted: 5 Feb 1993	A reserve located on the northern side of North Shore.
Innes Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A parish (lands administrative division).
Innes Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A minor trig station about 6.4 km SE of Mount Mickey Doran and about 6.4 km NW of the town of Comboyne.
Innes House	Located on Innes Lake. The home was built on Archibald Clunes Innes property after he received the grant in 1831.
Innes Peninsula Gazetted: 11 Feb 2011	A peninsula of land between Lake Innes and Innes Swamp in the suburb of Lake Innes. Origin: Innes Peninsula is named after Major Archibald Clunes Innes. His homestead was originally constructed circa 1831 to 1848. The homestead ruins and environs that are contained on the peninsular are a major historical monument to the pre 1850 period of settlement. (Source: Heritage.nsw.gov.au).
Innes Road	Road running to Innesvale in Hursley area Redbank.

Innes Street	Port Macquarie and also Wauchope. Named for Major Innes, Commandant of the penal settlement in 1826.
Innes Swamp Gazetted: 6 May 1973	A swamp just south of the township of Port Macquarie near the Port Golf Club. Previous name The Lake Swamp.
Innes View Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	(1) A locality on the Innes View Road about 4km SE of Mount Mickey Doran, and about 8km WNW of the town of Comboyne. (2) Property on the north side of the Hastings River just west of Rawdon Island near Narrowgut.
Innes View Road	Runs west from Comboyne.
Innesvale Gazetted: 16 Jun 2000	A rural locality on the Hastings River about 5km South of the locality of Pembroke. Now within Redbank bounded Locality. Proposed and assigned erroneously as bounded Locality Innes Vale. Previous name Innes Vale.
Inverary	Property in Laurieton - insolvent estate of William Nissen to be auctioned (see PMN, 10 Apr 1920 p.5).
Invermere Cottage	Home of Mr. P.George, William St. Port Macquarie (see PMN, 8 Jun 1918, p.5).
Iona	Property on the western side of the railway line at Pembroke.
Ireby	Farm on Herons Creek just south of Bobs Creek road.
Irvine Estate	Estate with frontage to the Hastings River Rawdon Island Creek and Naret Creek 4 miles from Port Macquarie (see advertisement PMN 24 Oct 1891 J. Downes Rawdon Island). Property located between Ennis and Blackmans Point near the meeting of the Hastings and Wilson Rivers (see PMN, 27 Feb 1943, p.3).
Isaacs Road	There are three roads named Isaacs Road in the Hastings LGA. (1) Waitui (2) Kerewong (3) Lorne
Ivers Mill	Village sawmill 8km south of Kew on the railway. See also Ivers Road.
Ivers Road	Road running alongside Camden Haven River near Rossglen. In 1932 Aub Ivers and Geoff Tabor and Clarrie Bignell, built a sawmill on the south side of Ross Glen. The mill burned down in March 1933 (see Manning River Times 18 March 1933, p.8). It was later rebuilt and continued operations until the 1950s.
