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- Nagundie** Property on the north side of the Hastings River 5km NW of Gannons Creek.
- Namguya** Homestead to the west of Ocean Drive 2km N of North Haven.
- Nana Klumpp Reserve**  
Gazetted: 27 Aug 1999  
A reserve on the northern side of Jordan Avenue at Bonny Hills. It is part of a Crown reserve and is bounded on the north and east by the Pacific Ocean. Origin: Doris Jane Mahala `Nana` Klumpp (17.12.1891 - 12.03.1993) was a much-loved Hastings personality. A mother of nine children, she was known for her musical ability. Her home for over thirty years was opposite the site of this reserve. (see PMN, 17 March & 7 April 1993).
- Nandari** Station 2km SE Rollands Plains.
- Naran** Another name for King Creek - possibly of aboriginal origin.
- Naret Creek** Near Portion 80 Redbank.
- Narran River** Another name for King Creek - see Postal Directory NSW 1832.
- Narrowgut**  
Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993  
(1) A low tide crossing in the Hastings River in a rural place, 1.5km E of the locality of Innesvale and 5km S of the locality of Pembroke at the western tip of Rawdon Island.  
(2) Property on the northern side of the Hastings River just south of Narrowgut in the Hursley area.
- Narrowgut Creek**  
Gazetted: 14 Nov 1980  
A watercourse about 5km long. It rises about 7km S of Ralfes Peak and flows generally to the E into Kapearrow Creek.
- Nawro** Farm on Upper Pappinbarra Road - just south of Pappinbarra Junction.
- Naylor**  
Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969  
A parish (lands administrative division).
- Nellingong** Property of Cdr. Thomas Caswell 1864-1872. 150 acres - For sale Manning River News 28 Apr 1866 - sold at 31/- an acre.
- Nellingowan** T.G. Wilson diary 25 May 1867 p.40 says: "Visited Hamilton (McIvor's) "Marie was away at Nellingowan".
- Nelson Street** Wauchope. Percy W. Nelson surveyor.

<b>Nelsons Bay</b>	The Australian of 4 Jan 1840 mentions this in reference to the beaching of the "Water Witch" there- Lady Nelson Beach.
<b>Nevann</b>	Farm on Kindee Road 10km NW of Long Flat.
<b>Nevisons Hill</b>	In the west Port Macquarie area near the racecourse. Nevison's were an early family in the district.
<b>New Inn</b>	Building in Hay Street Port Macquarie owned by Stephen Partridge 27 Aug 1830.
<b>Newholm</b>	Longworth's mill and ice works at Laurieton - it was burnt down in 1917.
<b>Newmans Road</b>	In the Yarrowitch area - runs NE off Oxley Highway -Tobin's River area.
<b>Newport Canal</b> Gazetted: 28 Aug 1992	A canal located between Newport Crescent and Laguna Place, Port Macquarie.
<b>Newport Island Road</b>	Port Macquarie. Originally part of Settlement Point Road which was severed by the construction of the Governor's Way Canal. The road leads to (manmade) Newport Island, part of the Settlement Shores development.
<b>Newtown</b>	At Hibbard where the Aquatic Club have their clubhouse (1985). This used to be the site of Fred Hayward's sawmill which he transferred from the bottom end of Clarence St. Nicholas Cain bought it made it a twin mill with the remains of his mill at Haytown or San Croix which was burnt down. Suburb of Port Macquarie 1890s - Cains sawmills there.
<b>Ngamba Place</b>	Bonny Hills. Named after the local Aboriginal people
<b>Nimola</b>	Property on Black Creek road 6km NW of Kendall. Farm 6km W of Logans Crossing.
<b>Nineteen Shilling Farm</b>	Property near Rollands Plains, owned by Maxwell Thompson.
<b>Nobby Head</b> Gazetted: 6 Apr 1973	A point on the North Coast between Nobbys Beach and Shelly Beach. It is about 2km SE of the town of Port Macquarie.
<b>Nobby Rock</b>	See Bird Rock.
<b>Nobbys Beach</b> Gazetted: 6 Apr 1973	A beach on the North Coast between Nobby Head and Flynn's Beach, ESE of the town of Port Macquarie.
<b>Noona Mena</b>	Station E of the Pacific Highway just north of Ryans Road - Lake Innes area.

<b>Norries Hall</b>	Community hall in Wauchope on the corner of High and Cameron St.
<b>North Branch State Forest</b> Gazetted: 8 Sep 1978	State forest in the Taree Forestry District Area about 329 hectares.
<b>North Brother</b> Gazetted: 22 Dec 1972	A prominent isolated mountain about 2km WSW of the Town of Laurieton, being the northernmost of the 'Three Brothers' named by Captain James Cook in 1770.
<b>North Brother</b> Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A locality 6km W of Perpendicular Point. It contains the Camden Haven State Forest. Its southern boundary is Watson Taylors Lake, and the locality of Kew adjoins to the west.
<b>North Haven</b> Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A town locality on the N side of Camden Haven Inlet about 4km by road SW by W of the town of Laurieton.
<b>North Haven Beach</b>	Beach between North Haven and Bonny Hills.
<b>North Wall Road</b>	North Shore. The road leading to the northern wall of the break wall at Port Macquarie, at the mouth of the Hastings River.
<b>North Shore</b> Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A locality on the northern bank of the Hastings River, 3km from its entrance at Port Macquarie and opposite the locality of Settlement Point.
<b>North Shore Beach</b> Gazetted: 11 Oct 1974	A beach that extends from Pelican Point to Point Plomer, about 12km long.
<b>Northam</b>	Property and house on the Oxley Highway. Fred Hayward had land adjoining it - Windeyer's home in 1855-60. Adjoined Fred Hayward's "Grantham" 1892. Albert Denham's property.
<b>Norwood</b>	(1) Henry St. John's house Westport (2 Mar 1918). (2) A property on the Upper Manning once owned by John Burnett Cooper (see Manning River Times, 10 Feb 1926, p.5).
<b>Nothofagus Canyon</b> Gazetted: 23 Apr 2004	A canyon situated approx. 2km NW of Cobcroft Cascades where the Gorge Creek meets the Hastings River. Nothofagus is the scientific name for the genus of tree Antarctic Beech.
<b>Nutshell</b>	On Little Loop Road 20km NW of Telegraph Point (Glen Esk area). Rawdon Island W A Spence (see PMN, 22.11.1907).
