Yadilla	Station between Ballengarra and Rollands Plains east of the Rollands Plains Road on the banks of Bril Bril Creek.
Yamminga	Station west of the North Coast Railway line 6km SW of Telegraph Point.
Yanindee	Farm on Tipperary Road - 6km NW of Lorne.
Yappin Yappin	Property on the Hastings River. Margaret McLean had the title to this land 20 Mar 1889. N.B. the Aboriginal name for the area around Wauchope is Yapun.yapun (<i>var. yapon.yapon</i>) Source:Lissarrague, A grammar and dictionary of Gathang (2010)
Yarandoo	Property just north of Boles Creek Road west of Bonny Hills.
Yarrabee Park	Station between the Pacific Highway and the railway 10km N of Telegraph Point west of Pipers Creek/Maria river junction.
Yarranabee Road	Port Macquarie. Yarranabee was the Aboriginal name for darling Point in Sydney. (Source: NSW Dept of Primary Industries. Plan of Management. Yarranabee park 2012). Yerinibe or Yeranabe (Yerinibe Goruey) was an Aboriginal man who, though born a Burrumattagal man (member of the Parramatta clan), was said to be 'King' of the Darling Point tribe in the 1830-1840 period. He is commemorated by Yarranabee Road, darling Point and Yarranabee Park, Rushcutters Bay. (Source: Dictionary of Sydney)
Yarras Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A minor trig station about 4.8km S of the village of Yarras and about 5.2km NNE of Mount Rockaree.
Yarras Gazetted: 16 April 1993	Township on the Oxley Highway west of Port Macquarie. Shortened form of Yarrows. Original grant to Major Innes on the Oxley highway west of Port Macquarie- on the Forbes River. Name of a block of land of Major Innes brother at Bathurst. The name Yarras is believed to be an attempt to anglicise the Bathurst aboriginal word meaning "much running water" (see article by Stanley Kennedy, Hastings shire Gazette, 10 Jun 1976) .Property of W. Nivison - he sold it to G & C.A. Hill for £6000 4631 acres. Veneer mill established there. Post Office established in 1875.
Yarras Creek Gazetted: 10 Jan 1969	A mostly perennial stream rising about 1km NE of Yarras Trig Station. It flows generally NE for about 6km into the Hastings River about 1.5km SE of Yarras.

Yarras House	Yarras - (see PMN, 13 Jan 1906).
Yarras Mountain	Station 6km S of Yarras on Costigan's Road.
Yarrimbah	Farm on the Ellenborough River 12km S of Ellenborough.
Yarrowell	Property also known as Doyle's Station -15km SW of Yarras - E.C. Cooper (Cooper Bros) there 1 Apr 1899.
Yarrowitch	Property of Capt. C.D. Fenwicke - house consisted of two four-roomed slab cottages with the usual offices at the rear, 60km W of Yarras on the Oxley Highway.
Yarrows	Early name for Major Innes property at Yarras. Parish of Ellenborough.
Yellow Gully Gazetted: 23 Feb 1973	A partly perennial gully stream rising about 5km ENE of Herons Creek Railway Station, flows generally SW for about 3km into Bobs Creek. Previous name Yellow Creek.
Yippin Creek Gazetted: 4 Dec 1987	A watercourse about 10km long. It rises about 5km SW of Wauchope and flows generally N by E then NE into the Hastings River. Flows through portion 4, Parish Koree, taken up by John Manghen. Plan prepared in 1833 shows the property name 'Yepping'. Previous name Yeppin Creek; Yepping Creek. N.B. the Aboriginal name for the area around Wauchope is Yapun.yapun (<i>var.</i> yapon.yapon) Source:Lissarrague, A grammar and dictionary of Gathang (2010)
Yippin Creek Gazetted: 16 Apr 1993	A locality about 18km N of the town of Herons Creek. Yippin Creek forms its eastern boundary, and the locality of Rosewood adjoins to the west.
Young Street	(1) Named after James Young who bought "Hamilton House" from Maria Hamilton in 1850. (2) Wauchope. J. H. Young MP, landholder (1924).
