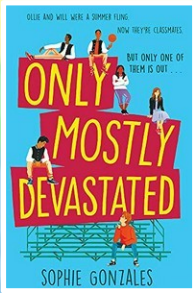


Peta Lyre's Rating Normal by *Anna Whateley*

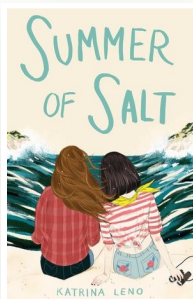
Only Mostly Devastated by *Sophie Gonzales*

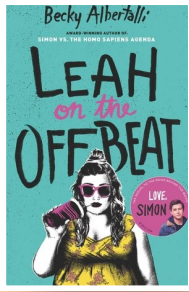
Fin & Rye & Fireflies by *Harry Cook*

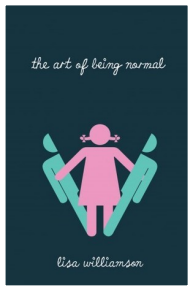
Leah on the Offbeat by *Becky Albertalli*

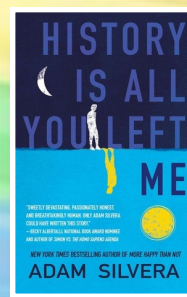
If I Was Your Girl by *Meredith Russo*

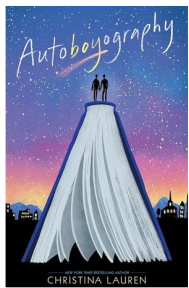
Noah Can't Even by *Simon James Green*

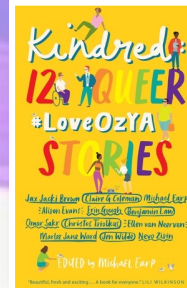
History Is All You Left Me by *Adam Silvera*
