


The Quiet and the Loud by Helena Fox


The Iron Raven by Julie Kagawa

Saltwater Boy by Bradley Christmas

Heartfelt and poignant, this coming of age story explores father-son relationships with themes of preserving the past and environmental care. When his Dad goes to jail Matthew and his mum move to the coast to renovate her late father's house. He strikes up a friendship with Old Bill, an Indigenous man who becomes a father figure to him. When his Dad gets out on parole Matthew's newfound peace is fractured and he struggles to navigate his evolving relationships.

Life is pretty good for sixteen-year-old Abby. Okay, her grandma has dementia so not everything is perfect but it is manageable with her best friend Ella by her side. The arrival of new girl Chloe and her inclusion in the friendship group throws up some challenges and when tragedy strikes Ella's family, Abby has to re-evaluate her own feelings and work out what friendship really means.

Blind Spot by Robyn Dennison

When Dale stumbles into a bedroom at a party and sees something amiss he backs away and runs. He's pretty drunk but he knows what he saw. Should he have said or done something? These questions haunt him and he doesn't know how to make things right.

A raw and unflinching exploration of challenging themes including consent, substance use and navigating sexuality and relationships.



Inkflower by Suzy Zail

A gritty novel based on a true story about family secrets, hope and healing. Lisa's father has six months to live and a story to tell about a boy sent to Auschwitz. It's a story he has kept hidden until now but Lisa doesn't want to hear it because she has secrets too. No one at school knows she is Jewish or that her dad is sick. Not even her boyfriend but that's all about to change and so is she.



The Girl With No Reflection by Keshe Chow

Ying Yue believes in love so when the royal matchmaker selects her to wed the crown prince Ying hopes that love is exactly what awaits her. However the family is notoriously reclusive, rarely leaving their walled palace and rumors swirl about previous royal brides disappearing. So when Ying discovers the dark truth the royal family has been hiding for centuries her whole world is shaken.



The Heretics Guide to Homecoming Books 1 & 2 by Sienna Tristen

This two part series is a sumptuous, slow-burning and mesmerising fantasy read. Ronoah is marked by the gods to be a trailblazer, meant to change the world but he is crippled with anxiety and self-doubt. Until he runs smack bang into charismatic, confusing and hypnotic Reilin who whisks Ronoah up into a cross-continental pilgrimage to the most sacred place on the planet.





Return to Sender by Lauren Draper

Seventeen year old Brodie has returned to her hometown to live with her eccentric grandmother above the last remaining Dead Letter Office - the place letters go when no ones claims them. Soon, Brodie is consumed by an unsolved mystery when she discovers the unclaimed letters of a group of teens who vanished. A layered and compelling mystery about family, first love and one town's tragedies.



Nightbirds #1 by Kate J Armstrong

In this fantasy realm the magic of women is outlawed but four girls with unusual powers have the chance to change it all and emerge from the shadows to determine their own fates. Fiercely feminist and set in an intoxicating world full of speakeasies with magic cocktails, glamour and handsome rogue alchemists, this fascinating world is full of whispered secrets and political intrigue.
